## UPDATES TO PARKING BY-LAW

Council recently passed a new consolidated Traffic and Parking by-law. The changes ensure:

- Roads are clear for Emergency Service vehicles
- Roads/sidewalks are clear for winter maintenance operations
- Residents have appropriate parking for their vehicles and are utilizing all available spaces on their property (including the garage) to keep roads as clear as possible; and
- Rules are clear and enforceable

### The Town's by-law will:

- ✓ Maintain the year-round three-hour parking limit
- ✓ Maintain the 7 to 11 p.m., three-hour parking exemption period
- ✓ No parking during any snow storms
- ✓ Parking Consideration Forms available for overnight parking for residents online at [www.eastgwillimbury.ca/parking](http://www.eastgwillimbury.ca/parking)



### New:

- ✓ No parking from 2 to 6 a.m. year-round
- ✓ Updated parking fines to align with municipal comparators

## Collection Tag Reminder

Collection tags are only required for extra garbage that is over the two bag limit as well as bulky items on your scheduled collection day. If you do not have extra garbage that is over the two bag limit collection tags are not required.

The first two bags of garbage do not require collection tags as they follow the Town's two bag limit. The second two bags of garbage require collection tags as they are over the two bag limit.

### WINTER WEATHER SAFETY TIPS

Winter weather is here and its important to clear snow/ice properly at home to ensure the safety of all road users. Follow these tips for proper snow removal:

- Remove ice, snow and other obstructions from catchbasins to allow proper drainage of snowmelt and rainwater
- Remove snow from around fire hydrants
- Pile snow on the right side of your driveway (when facing the road) when shovelling to help minimize the ridge of snow created by the snowplow at the end of your driveway
- Keep vehicles off the street. Vehicles left on the street during plowing operations will be ticketed.
- Keep snow or blow snow from your driveway onto the street or across the street onto other properties

### 2020 DOG LICENSES

2020 dog licenses are now available in Customer Service at the Civic Centre. Licenses are \$35.60 per dog or \$26.40 for seniors 65 and older. Tags must be worn when dogs are not on their own property.

If you are unable to visit the Civic Centre during regular business hours you can contact Animal Control directly at 1-888-644-5634. They will arrange with you a convenient time to purchase a tag from them. In addition, Animal Control also has dog tag sellers that go door to door and wear appropriate identification.
