

COUNCIL WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS

From January 9, 2018

York Region Updates:

1. Regional staff provided an overview of changes to the 2017 Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe and the implications those changes had on the Region's Municipal Comprehensive Review. The presentation also included updates on servicing capacity to accommodate growth in EG. A follow up presentation will be given to Council in June.

2. Regional staff provided an update on the delayed approval of the Upper York Servicing Solution's Individual Environmental Assessment by the province. The Region remains hopeful that an approval will be received in 2019, which would allow construction to begin. This delay has pushed potential commissioning of the UYSS from 2024 to 2026.

WHAT IS A ZONING BY-LAW?

A zoning by-law is a legal document that outlines land use and development in a community, such as:

- Where buildings and structures may be located.
- The types of buildings permitted and how they can be used.
- Lot sizes and dimensions, parking requirements, building heights and setbacks.

IS MY PROPERTY AFFECTED?

The proposed new zoning by-law applies to all lands within the Town of East Gwillimbury, including properties that are leased or rented.
