 Loads greater than 1 cubic yard will be charged **\$65.00 per tonne.**

Community Environmental Centres (CECs) provide residents with a convenient location to drop off a variety of materials, including those not easily managed through the current waste collection programs, such as bulky materials, shredded paper and electronics.

Materials Accepted



Recycle Zone

- Blue Box recyclables
- Shredded paper
- Televisions*
- Computers & monitors*
- Cell phones*
- VCRs & DVD players*
- Cameras*
- Energy efficient light bulbs
- Small household batteries

*Electronics limited to 4 computers/monitors, 2 televisions and up to 6 other units of electronic equipment per visit.

Please drop off shredded paper in clear plastic bags.

Reuse Zone

- Clothing, textiles & fabrics
- Books, DVDs & video tapes
- Housewares
- Hardware
- Tools
- Lumber
- Plumbing fixtures
- Lighting fixtures
- Windows & doors
- Cabinetry
- Furniture & antiques
- Refrigerated appliances*

*Items may be subject to a fee.

Bulky Recyclable Zone

- Metal appliances
- Scrap metal
- Wood
- Drywall
- Rubble & concrete
- Clean fill
- Styrofoam

Please drop off styrofoam in clear plastic bags.

Residual Waste Zone

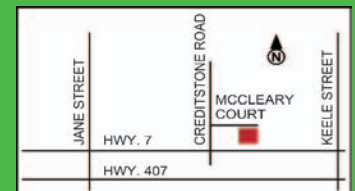

What is Household Hazardous Waste (HHW)

Any material that is corrosive, explosive, flammable or poisonous. These items should be disposed of with caution.

What are examples of HHW?

Paints, pesticides, propane tanks, batteries, pharmaceuticals, syringes, thermostats containing mercury, used motor oil and filters, fuels, fluorescent light tubes, energy efficient bulbs and many cleaning products.

How do I dispose of my of HHW?

- Keep materials in original containers, or ensure that the contents are clearly labelled
- Do not mix different products together
- Tightly cap all containers
- Bring them to your local HHW depot free of charge

Please Note:

- No commercial, industrial or medical office wastes accepted.
- No explosives (other than aerosols and propane cylinders), ammunition, PCBs, asbestos or radioactive wastes accepted.
- Needles and syringes from household medicinal use will be accepted in rigid containers only. No other pathological wastes will be accepted.

Materials Accepted



- Computers including modems, cables and software (e.g. Disks, CDs, DVDs)
- Monitors, printers, scanners, electronic games (e.g. Nintendos)
- Telephones, pagers, fax machines, cell phones
- Televisions (Limit 2 per visit. Please do not dis-assemble TVs as they contain hazardous materials.)
- VCRs, DVD players, radios, stereos and audio speakers
- Cameras, automobile "computer" modules

Materials Not Accepted



- Thermostats containing mercury
- Power tools*
- Electric typewriters*
- Microwave ovens*
- Household appliances*

Please Note:

- **Residential quantities only.** For further information on York Region's policy on quantity limits, please visit www.york.ca
- Remove all packaging and batteries before delivering to a Household Hazardous Waste Depot.
- Batteries and thermostats that contain mercury must be delivered to a Household Hazardous Waste Depot.

SCRAP METAL AND METAL APPLIANCES RECYCLING

What are metal appliances?

Metal appliances include items such as refrigerators, freezers, stoves, microwave ovens, etc.

How do I dispose of my metal appliances and scrap metal?

These items can be dropped off at the Region's East Gwillimbury and Georgina depots, or the McCleary Court CEC. Some local municipalities offer a pick up service for metal appliances. Please refer to your local waste collection calendar or website for further information.

Is there a charge for dropping off metal appliances?

A CFC removal fee of \$20 per unit will only be charged for those appliances containing CFC refrigerants, such as refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners and dehumidifiers, at the Region's appliance drop-off depots. York Region will continue to accept metal appliances without CFCs or displaying an approved CFC removal sticker, free of charge.
