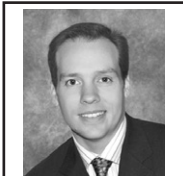

**STRATEGIC MESSAGE**

**East Gwillimbury Buys Water Infrastructure from Newmarket**

The Town of East Gwillimbury recently entered into an agreement to purchase two critical components of watermain infrastructure from Newmarket, on the east side of Yonge Street in 2007 and the west side of Yonge Street in 2009.

Outlined below are the main components of the infrastructure agreement:

- An unusual situation in York Region existed where Newmarket owned watermain infrastructure within the borders of East Gwillimbury. The agreement transfers the ownership of these pipes from Newmarket to East Gwillimbury (as is the case in other York Region municipalities).
- The \$1.5 million cost has been funded entirely through Development Charges and will cause no burden on property tax rates. East Gwillimbury Council has committed to “growth must pay for growth” principles, and residents can be assured that this principle was applied in completing the agreement. The \$1.5 million has been calculated to be a fair market value.
- **The water that flows within the watermains is from twenty Region of York wells located in East Gwillimbury, Newmarket and Aurora. These wells are interconnected through Regional and local watermains. The water traveling through the pipes is actually from various sources throughout the Region.**
- East Gwillimbury is committed to the environment, taking advantage of existing infrastructure will reduce the overall footprint on our community by avoiding the construction of a third watermain.
- Any new development serviced through these watermains, like all other future development in East Gwillimbury, will adhere to the Town’s national award winning policy on LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) standards. Development and growth on the Yonge Street and Green Lane corridors and other areas within the Town will be coordinated in concert with East Gwillimbury’s Official Plan Review process. All residents are encouraged to provide input to the Official Plan Review by visiting the Town’s website.
