Top Fire Safety Tips for Halloween Night

- The best costumes are light coloured or bright and reflective.
- Keep costumes short to avoid tripping and falling. Minimize the risk of contact with candles or other ignition sources by avoiding baggy pants, loose frills or billowing skirts.
- Make sure that children know how to call 9-1-1 or their local emergency number if they experience an emergency.
- Teach children to STOP, DROP and ROLL should their clothing catch fire: STOP immediately, DROP to the ground and cover face with hands and ROLL over and over to extinguish the flames.
- Consider using only battery-powered lights or chemical light sticks in decorations.
- Small battery-powered lights are the safest for use in jack-o'-lanterns. If you use a candle, try a tea light or votive candle in a non-combustible holder.
- Always keep candles, matches and lighters out of the reach of children.
- Place candlelit jack-o'-lanterns on sturdy surfaces, away from anything that can burn, such as curtains and Halloween costumes.
- Keep decorations such as cornstalks and bales of hay away from candlelit jack-o'-lanterns.
- Ensure that electrical outlets are not overloaded with holiday lighting or special effects.
- Check that the batteries in your smoke alarms work.

FIREARM DISCHARGE/DEER HUNT

During the weeks of November 1st to November 5th, and November 29th to December 3rd, 2010 the Ministry of Natural Resources will hold a controlled deer hunt.

Town of East Gwillimbury By-law #2004-81 regulates the discharge of firearms (not hunting) within the Town. The By-law and Discharge Area map are available for review at www.eastgwillimbury.ca, Corporate Services, Office of the Municipal Clerk, By-Law & Licensing Services.

THINKING GREEN



Challenge yourself and try reducing the amount of water your household consumes; using less water ultimately leads to saving energy and money.

There are many different ways to reduce the amount of water used in your home, for example, replacing showerheads and toilets with low flow models will significantly cut down regular water usage. Through the installation of low flow showerheads, a family of four can save approximately 160,000 liters or water a year. By running your dishwasher and washing machine only when full, you can eliminate unnecessary loads or cycles. If you are in the market for a new dishwasher or washing machine, purchase an Energy Star model which is designed to use less water and significantly reduces energy. It is also important to regularly check for water leaks in your home; an unnoticed leak can be the source of considerable water loss. Give these tips a try and significantly reduce the amount of water used in your home.
