NOTICE OF PESTICIDE USE

2011 MOSQUITO CONTROL PROGRAM

As in previous years, the granular biological control agent Vectobac (Bti) [No. 18158 registered under the *Pest Control Products Act (Canada)*] will be applied by helicopter to hardwood bush and areas with an abundance of standing water throughout the Town of East Gwillimbury during early to mid-April during daylight hours, weather permitting.

A map indicating the areas of application is available for viewing during regular business hours in the Town Civic Centre, Corporate Services Department and on the Town's web site www.eastgwillimbury.ca. You must submit the mosquito submission form to the Town of East Gwillimbury in writing by no later than Friday, March 18th, 2011, indicating whether:

- you approve of having the Vectobac applied to your property; or
- you object to having the Vectobac applied to your property.

Maintaining your vehicle's tires can reduce the amount of harmful emissions released into the environment. The most accurate time to check the inflation of your tires is when they are cold, prior to driving. Properly inflated tires will pollute less, cost less in fuel and will be safer on the road.
