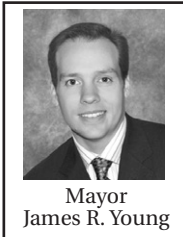

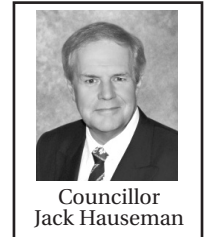

### COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

#### Lake Simcoe Conservation Authority (LSRCA) Well Decommissioning Program

#### Northern Six Joint Waste Contract

East Gwillimbury Council has now approved the Memorandum of Understanding for the Northern Six waste contract. The contract has been awarded to Turtle Island Recycling, who will be collecting the Green Bins, Recycling and other waste beginning September 18, 2007.

#### 2006 Fiscal Surplus

Council received a report outlining its 2006 Fiscal Surplus at \$267,330. The surplus was achieved by early budget adoption, continuous improvement and identifying efficiencies throughout the year.

#### Organizational Assessment at East Gwillimbury

Council approved the final phase of the organizational assessment within the Town of East Gwillimbury. Phase I and II concentrated on the direct operational departments, where Phase III has an emphasis on customer care. Among the changes happening around staffing arrangements is the implementation of a customer care coordinator who will oversee and ensure that all resident concerns are resolved in a timely and satisfactory method.

#### East Gwillimbury Recognized as a National Environmental Leader

East Gwillimbury has recently received two major National accolades for its progressive environmental policies.

East Gwillimbury won a FCM-CH2M HILL Sustainable Community Award on Saturday, June 2 at a recognition ceremony held at FCM's 70th Annual Conference and Municipal Expo™ in Calgary. The Awards recognize municipal leadership in sustainable community development and give national recognition to projects that demonstrate environmental excellence and innovation in service delivery. East Gwillimbury was recognized for being the first in Canada to adopt Town-wide Energy Star® standards for new homes.

Selected by the Clean Air Committee, based in Halifax, and announced at this year's Smog Summit in Toronto, East Gwillimbury was the recipient of the Ontario Region award for its "Outstanding Leadership in increasing the Energy Efficiency of New Construction." East Gwillimbury is one of two municipalities in Canada to be recognized by the Canadian Clean Air Day Committee.

Residents (Youth) are invited to attend the "Park Design Open House" to view the mountain bike features available and provide comments on favorable components.

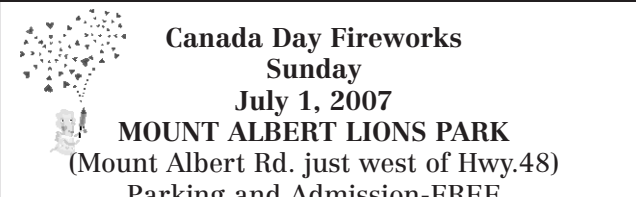
