#### HOLLAND RIVER BLVD. IN HOLLAND LANDING

The Town will be installing a new pedestrian bridge over the East Holland River at 68 Holland River Boulevard.

The new bridge will provide a link across the Holland River to the Nokiidaa Trail System to the south.

A temporary access road from Holland River Boulevard to the river, will be required to access the site. Work on the temporary access road commenced on July 14, 2008.

The entire project should be completed before August 31, 2008, weather permitting.

Construction vehicles will be limited to Holland River Boulevard.

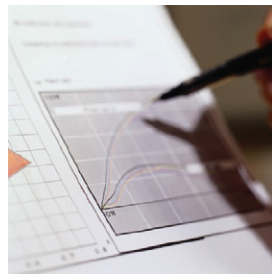
