Ontario Ministry of Transportation
Temporary Mount Albert Road Closure

The Ontario Ministry of Transportation has advised that they will be commencing construction of the overpass structure at Mt. Albert Road.

Mount Albert Road will be closed from Colonel Weyling Boulevard to Woodbines Avenue from September 2, 2008 until December 31, 2008.

The Ministry of Transportation has designated the detour route as Queensville Sideroad and Green Lane via Woodbine Avenue or Leslie Street. Project officials will be delivering notices door-to-door to directly impacted area residents.

When making lunch for school or work, pack food in reusable containers instead of using aluminum foil, plastic food wrap or plastic bags. Instead of buying individually packaged snacks, buy snacks in larger quantities where you can package it yourself, this will reduce packaging waste, save you money in the long run while giving you control over the quantity of food. For beverages, refill a stainless steel bottle with juice or water each day instead of sending a tetra-pak. Also, try packing lunches in a re-usable lunch box or cloth bag. Together, these tips will significantly reduce the amount of waste you create each day at lunch.
