Curbside Collection Reminders



Place garbage, Green Bins, Blue Boxes and yard waste at the curb by 7 a.m. on your scheduled day, but not earlier than 8 p.m. the night before.



Maximum of two bags/cans of garbage every two weeks. Extra garbage (in excess of the two bag maximum) may be brought to the Georgina Waste Transfer Station (see page 3).



Additional garbage bags/containers and bulky items, must have a collection tag attached. Collection tags are sold in quantities of five and can be purchased at Customer Service located at the Civic Centre (19000 Leslie St.)

Acceptable Containers for Garbage

Metal or plastic cans

- Must have 2 handles and a secure lid
- Do not use ties/bungee cords
- Maximum weight 22 kg (50 lbs)
- Maximum size 25 gallons/94 litres and 32 gallons/121 litres

Plastic garbage bags

- Must be securely tied
- No loose grocery/kitchen catcher bags
- Do not place sharp objects inside bags.
 Place these materials in a separate, sealed and labeled cardboard box.
- Maximum weight 22 kg (50 lbs)
- Maximum size 76cm (30 inches) by 122cm (48 inches)



All Blue Box materials must be placed in a receptacle with a total capacity between 12 and 22 gallons only. Please do not use lids or nets to cover the container.



COLLECTION TAGS

Collection Tags allow you to set out additional garbage that is over the two item* limit as well as bulky items on your scheduled collection day. Be sure to keep these tags handy for times when you have more than the garbage limit.



Use one collection tag for each standard sized garbage bag, garbage can or oversized item over the two item limit.

Attach the sticker around the neck of the garbage bag. If using a garbage can place it around the neck of the top bag. For bulky items place it directly on the oversized item so it is clearly visible.



*Due to COVID-19 restrictions the Town increased the garabge collection limit to 5 bags/items per household. Collection Tags may be used on items that are over the five bag/item limit. 



What Goes in the Green Bin?

Bag All Material in the Green Bin: Material in the green bin **MUST** be bagged and tied. Using compostable bags or paper bags are preferred. **Materials placed in black garbage bags will not be collected.**

Food and Food Scraps

If you can eat it, it goes in the Green Bin. Meat and fish bones and shells, fat, grease and lard (solidified), small amounts of cooking oil, baking supplies, dairy products, egg shells, coffee filters/grounds and tea bags, corn cobs/husks and nuts/shells.

Soiled or Shredded Paper

Shredded paper may be placed in the Green Bin in small amounts.

Other paper products that go in the Green Bin include; butcher and cheese paper (non-waxed), microwave popcorn bags, flour and sugar bags, muffin paper, soiled paper plates, paper towels and tissues, paper serviettes, and any non-waxed paper or cardboard that contains food residue (sauce, cheese, etc.). NO waxed paper.

Personal Care Items

Diapers, hair, nail clippings, sanitary products, tampons, incontinence products, tissues.

Pet Products

Animal bedding, pet waste, kitty litter, bird seed, pet food, pet fur, feathers and sawdust (wood sources only).

Houseplants and Flowers

In small quantities only, no yard waste





Yard Waste

Yard Waste is collected **WITH RECYCLING EVERY SECOND WEEK** from April to November, as noted throughout this calendar (there are some exceptions due to statutory holidays).

There is no limit on the amount of yard waste that can be placed for collection, providing that acceptable containers are used.

A "yard waste" sticker must be placed on the open rigid containers used for yard waste. The stickers may be picked up at the Civic Centre, also at the Mount Albert and Holland Landing Libraries.



Acceptable Containers:

Place weeds, plant trimmings and leaves in paper yard bags or any rigid open top container that has handles.

Bundle branches as shown. Use twine only, no ropes please.



No plastic bags please!




These items should NOT be placed with Yard Waste:

Kitchen scraps, **grass clippings**, rocks, **dirt**, **sod**, tree stumps, branches larger than 10cm (4") in diameter, flower pots/trays, painted or treated wood and animal droppings.

Imagine how it feels to be surrounded by trees and forests – the cool shade, the aromatic smell, the feeling of escaping time as you connect with nature. Now imagine always having that at your fingertips.



FIGHT THE BITE! AGAINST BLACKLEGGED TICKS AND LYME DISEASE

What is Lyme disease?



Lyme disease is caused by a bacteria called Borrelia burgdorferi which is spread through the bite of an infected blacklegged tick.


Symptoms of Lyme disease may include:

- · A skin rash · Fever or chills
- · Fatigue or weakness
- · Dizziness or confusion Muscle and joint pain
- Headache
- Swollen lymph nodes

See your health care provider if you develop symptoms of Lyme disease after a tick bite or after visiting a wooded or brushy area.

Protect yourself in wooded or brushy areas

- · Wear light-coloured, long-sleeved clothing and closed footwear
- Use insect repellents containing DEET or icaridin
- Walk in the middle of trails
- · Shower when you get home
- · Check yourself, your family and your pets for ticks
- Remove attached ticks as soon as possible



What are blacklegged ticks?



- Ticks are small bugs that feed off the blood of animals and humans
- Adult ticks are the size of a sesame seed and nymphs are the size of a poppy seed
- · Ticks are found on tall grasses and bushes in wooded areas
- · They can attach and feed up to five days

If you find a tick on you or or a family member remove it quickly




- 1. Grasp the tick with tweezers as close as possible to your skin and pull it straight out
- Do not put anything on the tick or try to burn it off
- Disinfect the area with rubbing alcohol
- 4. Visit etick.ca for FREE tick identification

Recap needle and place into approved sharp container offered free of charge at any participating pharmacy.





Once the sharp waste has reached the designated fill line, snap lid closed by securing the strip.






To permanently close the sharps container, insert the tab into the opening to secure the lid down.



Always use an approved sharps container when disposing of used sharps to help reduce the risk of needlestick injuries.

What is West Nile virus?

West Nile virus is spread to humans from the bite of an infected mosquito.


How to protect yourself when outdoors

- Wear light-coloured, long-sleeved shirts and pants
- Use insect repellents containing DEET or icaridin
- Cover up at dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active




How York Region protects you

York Region's West Nile Virus Program includes larviciding over 100,000 catch basins during the summer and using mosquito traps to capture and test for West Nile virus infected mosquitoes.



Mosquito-proof your home

- Clean up areas of standing water around your home
- Ensure door and window screens are tight-fitting and in good repair
- Clean up pools / pool covers
- · Turn over wading pools
- · Empty out flower pots
- Clear eavestroughs, storm and roof gutters
- · Clean bird baths weekly
- Empty water in old tires

What is Household Hazardous Waste?



Household hazardous waste (HHW) is anything in your home that is corrosive, explosive, flammable or poisonous and is no longer needed. It should be brought to a HHW depot where it will be disposed of safely.

Examples of HHW:

- Aerosol cans (full or partially full)
- Batteries
- Cleaning products
- Cosmetics
- Fertilizers
- Fluorescent light bulbs and tubes
- · Gasoline (containers may not be returned)
- Glues and adhesives
- Nail polish and polish remover
- Paints (liquid and solid)

Paint thinner and varnish remover.

- · Perfume and cologne
- Pesticides, insecticides and herbicides
- Pharmaceuticals
- Propane cylinders/tanks
- Pool chemicals
- Sharps (needles/syringes) must be in puncture proof container
- Used motor oil and filters

Residents can drop off 60L of household hazardous waste and 20 compact fluorescent tubes per household per day.

What is Electronic Waste?



Electronic waste (e-waste) is any electronic equipment in your home that no longer works and cannot be repaired. E-waste should not be thrown in the garbage as these items contain materials considered to be hazardous.

Examples of e-waste:

- Cables
- Cameras and camcorders
- · Cell phones, telephones, pagers and fax machines
- · Computer towers, laptops, tablets, modems, keyboards and mice

- · Game systems
- Monitors, printers, scanners and typewriters
- Televisions
- · VCRs, DVD players, radios, stereos, speakers

Maximum 50 kg per household per day. Remove all packaging and batteries. Disassembled electronics will not be accepted.



On average, York Region households throw away \$1,500 worth of food each year.

Here are some simple tips to reduce food waste and save time and money:

- · Plan ahead and shop with a list
- · Buy only what you need; bulk buying or buying on sale is only cost effective if the product is actually used
- Choose recipes you can make ahead

FATS, OILS and GREASE

Fats, Oils and Grease (FOG) can clog your pipes and our sewers when poured down the sink, drain or toilet.

Fats, oils and grease include:

butter and margarine, meat fats, salad dressings, cooking oils (including deep frying oils), sauces, gravies, shortening and lard.


Proper Disposal

- · Fats, oils and grease should be allowed to cool and harden, then scraped into the green bin
- . Use a small amount of paper towel to help wipe and absorb the liquid before placing it in your green bin
- · Liquid cooking oil can also be dropped off at a York Region waste depot to be recycled

Top Ten Collection Tips

Follow these handy "DO's and DON'Ts" to ensure your items are collected every time.

DO put your garbage cans/bags out by 7am on your collection day

DO ensure any and all straps, cords or other restraints are removed from your containers

DO bundle all branches with non-plastic twine or string max 60 cm (24") x 90cm (36")

DO place bulky/large articles out with your regular garbage on collection day

DO place only small amounts of shredded paper in the green bin and it should be in a compostable bag. Large amounts of shredded paper can be dropped off at select York Region waste depots

DO ensure that any broken glass is placed in a sealed box labeled "BROKEN GLASS" and put out with your regular waste

DON'T put any recyclables in your black bag, place in your blue box instead -see back inside cover for recycling guide

DON'T place any household hazardous, construction/demolition materials or any other non-collectible materials at the curbside for collection

DON'T place sod, grass clippings or dirt in with your yard waste

DON'T place plastic toys in your blue box

DON'T put any containers/bags out that are heavier than 50 lbs

DON'T put used masks, gloves or wipes in the blue box, these go in the garbage



Metal Item Recycling • Bulky Item Pick-up

Large Metal Items

Large metal items (White Goods) such as appliances, barbecues (no propane tanks), bed frames, furnaces, hot water heaters, metal bath tubs, storage sheds and bicycles must be recycled. Call 1-866-421-5625 to arrange for a special curbside collection.

NOTE: For safety, remove doors from fridges, freezers and ovens.

If a special collection is not booked, metal items will not be collected. Metal appliances and scrap metal can also be dropped off at select York Region Depots. (see page 3 for details).

Bulky Items such as Upholstered Furniture, Mattresses and Carpeting, etc.

These items, with a collection tag may be placed curbside for pick-up on your regular bi-weekly garbage collection day. Please break down or separate large/heavy items, if possible. Please note, that the tank and bowl must be separated on two-piece toilets to ensure collection.

Bundle small loose pieces. Tie carpeting and linoleum in rolls measuring no longer than 1.2 metres (4 ft) and weighing less than 20 kilograms (44 lbs).





