

## CWC/COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

From April 4, 2018

**Potential Retirement Residence Public Meeting -** Fieldgate has submitted an application to construct a retirement residence in Sharon. A public meeting has been recommended to be held on May 15, 2018 for the public to provide feedback on this project. **Green Lane Secondary Plan (GLSP) -** The GLSP outlines a land use plan for future development along the Green Lane Corridor. Committee of the Whole Council (CWC) recommended adoption of the GLSP which will be reviewed for a decision by Council on April 17, 2018. Once adopted, the GLSP will then be reviewed by York Region for final approval.

**Zoning By-Law -** CWC received the comprehensive Zoning By-Law Review Report, which will be brought back to the May 1, 2018 Council meeting for a decision. This will allow residents a final opportunity to review the documents and speak with staff. **Health & Active Living Plaza partnership update -** The Town is working to finalize partnership agreements for the HALP. Following significant partnership discussions, staff will be moving into phase two of the planning process to formalize partnerships in advance of facility design work. The plaza which will have a Town operated aquatics facility and a new library branch is proposed to open in Queensville once the population reaches 40,000 residents, which is projected to be in approximately 2021.
