This past weekend, the York Region COVID-19 enforcement task force conducted an inspection blitz on businesses to ensure they were following the COVID-19 safety protocols and procedures. This blitz was part of York Regional Council's commitment to increase enforcement to protect residents, and employees throughout the Region. I fully support these inspections and remind residents that everyone must continue to do all that we can to control the spread of COVID-19. If we fail to act now there will be much greater risks to our citizens in the coming weeks.

The inspection blitz was focused on big box retail stores and fitness centres. In East Gwillimbury, 12 businesses were inspected, and I am proud to share that during the inspections, it was observed that health regulations were being followed, including social distancing, capacity limits and face masks being worn.
