Responsibilities include: flower, shrub and tree planting; bed edging and trimming; shrub/tree trimming; fertilization; removal of litter and other trash; garbage receptacle and recyclable container collection and removal of contents; assessing and recommending the hire of full and part time staff complement; design of interior landscapes and provide consultation related to park layout and design; management of the urban tree canopy; planning of annual planting events; greenhouse growing operation; contributing to annual budget and priority planning; and providing excellent customer service.

The successful candidate will hold a Diploma or Certificate in Horticulture coupled with 3 years of municipal experience in horticulture and tree maintenance. In addition, the individual will have obtained the following: International Society of Arboriculture (ISA) Certified Arborist; Land Extermination License - Industrial Vegetation and Landscape Exterminator; Chainsaw Certification; Chipper Certification. Knowledge of native trees, shrubs, grasses and herbaceous plants and their growing conditions. Knowledge of existing and emerging invasive species including plants and pests and their associated management/control methods.
