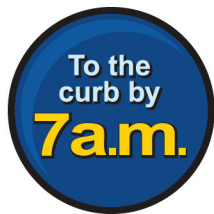

Curbside Collection Reminders



Collection tags can be purchased in quantities of five at the Civic Centre and Sports Complex.



Large metal items **require special pick-up**. To schedule a pick-up on your collection day, call GFL at 1-866-421-5625.



Green Bin - Weekly



Un-waxed paper **can** go in the green bin along with paper towel, paper plates and tissues.



NO BLACK GARBAGE BAGS IN GREEN BIN

Only compostable bags can be used.



Fats, oils and grease **can** go in the green bin. Let it cool first.

Dryer sheets, dryer lint, cigarette butts, wood and yard waste **can not** go in the green bin.



Blue Bin - Weekly



Bin Reminders

- No lids or wheels
- Do not line with bags
- No nets or covers

Reduce wind-blown litter

- Put heavier items on top
- Do not overfill your blue box



Batteries, cell phones, calculators and other electronics **can not** go in the blue bin. Check the Recycle Coach App for more details on correct recycling.

Garbage - Biweekly



Bin Reminders

- Must have two handles
- Must have a secure lid
- Don't use bungee cords

Bag Reminders

- Must be securely tied

More than two bags/items require a collection tag. Purchase collection tags at the Civic Centre.

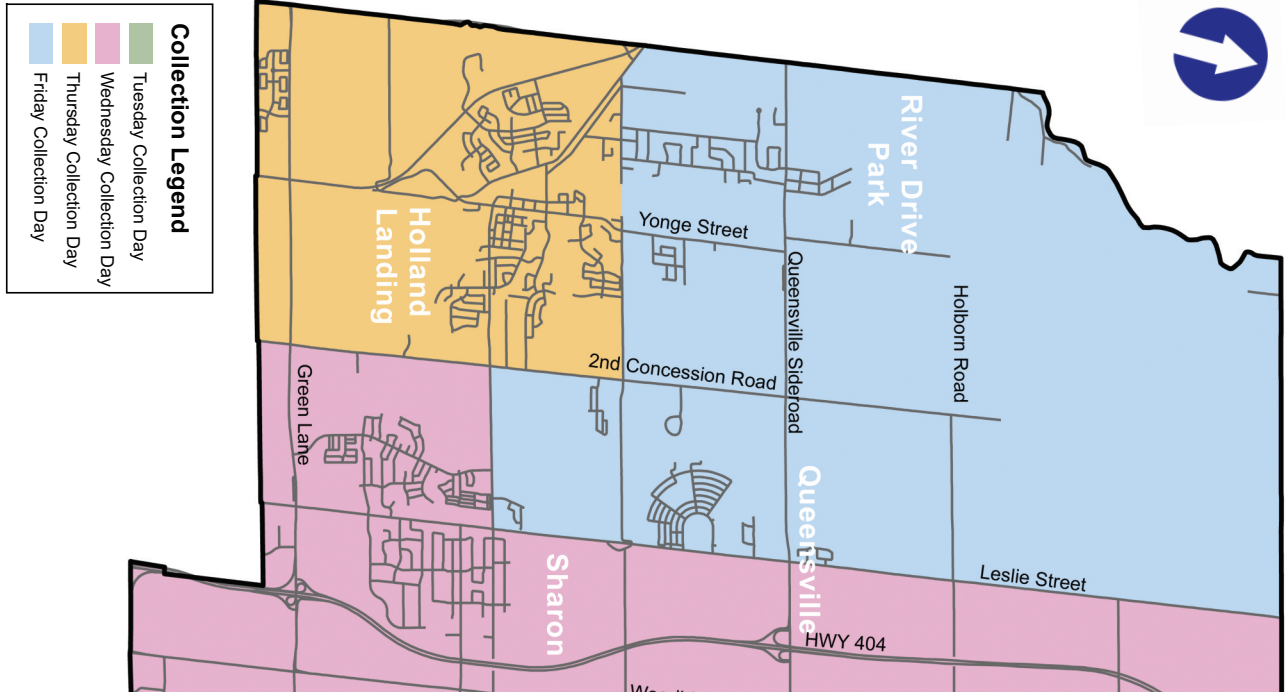

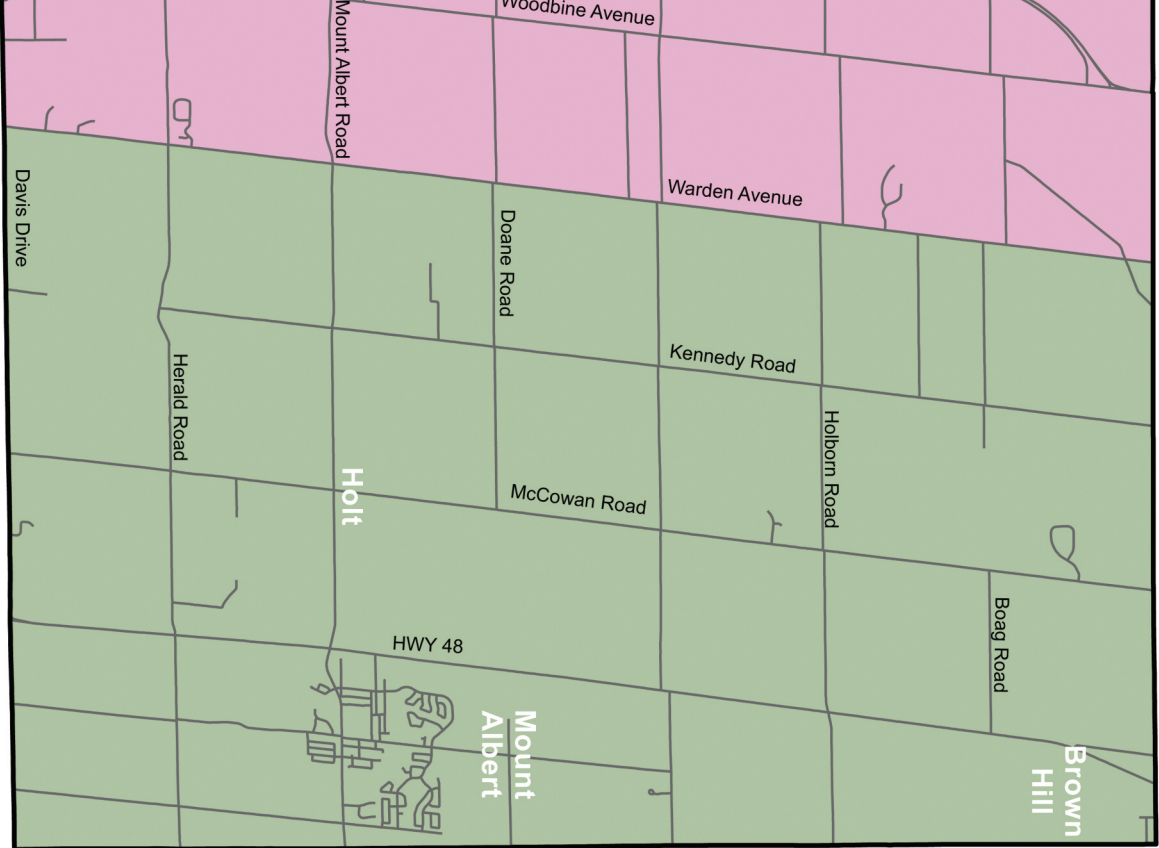

Blue Box Reminders



Weekly Collection Reminders

- Empty and rinse containers before placing them in your blue box.
- Recyclable materials can be mixed; no sorting required.
- Place recyclables loose inside your blue box, not in a plastic bag.
- Items placed in bags can't be recycled and will not be collected.
- There is no limit to the number of blue boxes you can set out.
- Flatten cardboard, tie it in bundles (60cm x 60cm x 30cm) and place it next to your blue box.
- Cardboard boxes or reusable containers with attached lids are not acceptable recycling containers.

Garbage Reminders



Weekly Collection Reminders

- Maximum of two items per garbage day. A garbage item can be a bag, garbage can (maximum 125L/33gal), bundle (maximum 1.2m/4ft) or piece of furniture.
- Items above the two item limit must have a collection tag attached.
- Cart style bins with attached flip lids are not accepted.
- Sharp items (glass, ceramics, mirrors, broken toilets, etc.) must be boxed or covered in cardboard, and marked as "Glass for Disposal".
- Toilets set out at the curb must be emptied of all liquids and separated into two pieces (tank and bowl) unless it is a one-piece toilet. Tank and bowl count as one item.

Unacceptable Items



Recyclables, organics, yard waste/grass clippings, animal carcasses, concrete, drywall or other construction/renovation materials, hazardous waste and electronic waste. Check EG's Recycle Coach App for disposal options.

Metal and Bulky Item Collection

Large Metal Items

Large metal items must be recycled and scheduled for free collection. Remove doors from fridges, freezers and ovens. Contact GFL to schedule collection. You do not need a collection tag.



Bulky Items

These items, with a collection tag, may be placed curbside for pick-up on your regular bi-weekly garbage collection day.

Green Bin Reminders



Weekly Collection Reminders

- Organics must be bagged, securely tied and placed in your green bin.
- Compostable, paper or plastic bags can be used to line your green bin.
- There is no limit to the number of green bins you can set out.

How to Avoid Pests

- Store your bin inside (i.e. garage or shed).
- Set your bin out in the morning (by 7 a.m.) instead of the night before.
- Always securely latch your bin.
- If your bin is stored outside, use a bungee cord to secure lid. Cords must be removed before placing your bin at the curb. Your green bin can also be hung on a sturdy hook to prevent animals from accessing it.

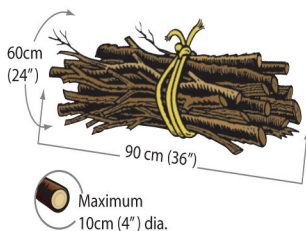

Unlimited yard waste collection takes place every other week from April to November. A “yard waste” sticker or sign must be placed on open containers used for yard waste.

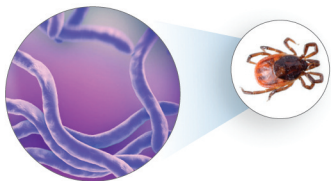

FIGHT THE BITE! AGAINST BLACKLEGGED TICKS AND LYME DISEASE

What is Lyme disease?



Symptoms of Lyme disease may include:

- A skin rash
- Fatigue or weakness
- Headache
- Fever or chills
- Dizziness or confusion
- Muscle and joint pain
- Swollen lymph nodes

See your health care provider if you develop symptoms of Lyme disease after a tick bite or after visiting a wooded or brushy area.

Lyme disease is caused by a bacteria called *Borrelia burgdorferi* which is spread through the bite of an infected blacklegged tick.

Protect yourself in wooded or brushy areas

- Wear light-coloured, long-sleeved clothing and closed footwear
- Use insect repellents containing DEET or icaridin
- Walk in the middle of trails
- Shower when you get home
- Check yourself, your family and your pets for ticks
- Remove attached ticks as soon as possible

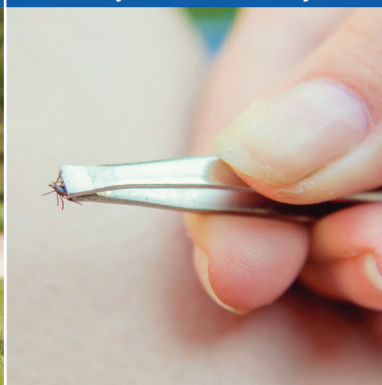


What are blacklegged ticks?





















- Ticks are small bugs that feed off the blood of animals and humans
- Adult ticks are the size of a sesame seed and nymphs are the size of a poppy seed
- Ticks are found on tall grasses and bushes in wooded areas
- They can attach and feed up to five days

If you find a tick on you or a family member remove it quickly



1. Grasp the tick with tweezers as close as possible to your skin and pull it straight out
2. Do not put anything on the tick or try to burn it off
3. Disinfect the area with rubbing alcohol
4. Visit etick.ca for **FREE** tick identification

Know Before You Throw!

Up to 20% of materials placed in the blue box do not belong there.

These items do NOT belong in the blue box.



Coffee cups and paper takeout cups belong in the garbage

Most paper cups are lined with a thin layer of plastic, making it difficult to separate the materials and recycle the paper.



Tissue and paper towel belong in the green bin

Used tissue and paper towel are compostable and go in the green bin.



Plastic bags, wrap and wrappers belong in the garbage

If placed in the blue box, these items get tangled in the sorting equipment and contaminate other recyclables at the recycling facility.

Tip: Reuse plastic bags or find a retailer with a plastic bag take-back program.



Black plastics belong in the garbage

Black plastic is difficult to mechanically sort at the recycling facility.



Styrofoam containers and trays belong in the garbage

Styrofoam is costly to sort and when placed with other recyclables, it becomes contaminated.



Masks, Gloves and Wipes Belong in the Garbage

These items contaminate other recyclables and are a health and safety risk for waste collection workers.



Remember to:

- ✓ Empty and rinse all food from containers before placing them in your blue box.
- ✓ Place recyclables loose inside your blue box, not in a plastic bag.

FIGHT THE BITE! AGAINST WEST NILE VIRUS

What is West Nile virus?



West Nile virus is spread to humans from the bite of an infected mosquito.

How to protect yourself when outdoors

- Wear light-coloured, long-sleeved shirts and pants
- Use insect repellents containing DEET or icaridin
- Cover up at dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are most active



How York Region protects you

York Region's West Nile Virus Program includes larviciding over 100,000 catch basins during the summer and using mosquito traps to capture and test for West Nile virus infected mosquitoes.



Mosquito-proof your home























- Clean up areas of standing water around your home
- Ensure door and window screens are tight-fitting and in good repair
- Clean up pools / pool covers
- Turn over wading pools
- Empty out flower pots
- Clear eavestroughs, storm and roof gutters
- Clean bird baths weekly
- Empty water in old tires

What is Household Hazardous Waste?



Household hazardous waste (HHW) is anything in your home that is corrosive, explosive, flammable or poisonous and is no longer needed. It should be brought to a HHW depot where it will be disposed of safely.

Examples of HHW:

- Aerosol cans (full or partially full)
- Batteries
- Cleaning products
- Cosmetics
- Fertilizers
- Fluorescent light bulbs and tubes
- Gasoline (containers may not be returned)
- Glues and adhesives
- Nail polish and polish remover
- Paints (liquid and solid)
- Paint thinner and varnish remover
- Perfume and cologne
- Pesticides, insecticides and herbicides
- Pharmaceuticals
- Propane cylinders/tanks
- Pool chemicals
- Sharps (needles/syringes) must be in puncture proof container
- Used motor oil and filters

Residents can drop off 60L of household hazardous waste and 20 compact fluorescent tubes per household per day.

What is Electronic Waste?



Electronic waste (e-waste) is any electronic equipment in your home that no longer works and cannot be repaired. E-waste should not be thrown in the garbage as these items contain materials considered to be hazardous.

Examples of e-waste:

- Cables
- Cameras and camcorders
- Cell phones, telephones, pagers and fax machines
- Computer towers, laptops, tablets, modems, keyboards and mice
- Game systems
- Monitors, printers, scanners and typewriters
- Televisions
- VCRs, DVD players, radios, stereos, speakers

Maximum 50 kg per household per day. Remove all packaging and batteries. Disassembled electronics will not be accepted.

- Allow fats, oils and grease to cool
- Use a spatula to wipe or scrape FOG into your green bin
- Drop off oils that do not harden, such as liquid cooking oils, at a York Region waste depot

Items **NOT** Collected at the Curb

Household Hazardous Waste

Household Hazardous Waste is anything in your home that is explosive, flammable, corrosive or poisonous.



Household Hazardous Waste includes:

- Aerosol cans (full or partially full)
- Cleaning products
- Automotive oils and fluids
- Prescription medicines
- Needles and syringes (must be in puncture-proof containers)
- Batteries
- Fluorescent tube/compact fluorescent (CFL) bulbs
- Cosmetics, perfume, nail polish and remover
- Pesticides and garden products
- Propane cylinders/tanks
- Paints, paint thinners and stains
- Pool chemicals

Construction and Removal Waste

Construction and renovation waste such as drywall, wooden skids, concrete, windows, cabinets, shingles, tiles, counters, sinks, siding, etc. is not collected at the curb. These materials can be taken to select York Region waste depots. Learn more at www.york.ca/wastedepots



Tire Recycling

Tires can be recycled at select York Region waste depots. Tires can be on or off rims.

Electronic Waste

Electronic waste is any electronic equipment in your home that no longer works and cannot be repaired. These items must not be thrown in the garbage because they contain hazardous materials and often have recyclable parts.

Electronic waste includes:


































- Computers, laptops, monitors and accessories
- TVs, VCRs and DVD players
- Mobile phones, tablets and GPS units
- Gaming systems, cords and cables
- Printers, fax machines and cameras
- Radios, stereos and speakers



Don't put these items in the garbage, blue box or green bin. Check the Recycle Coach App for recycling/disposal options.

- Cardboard boxes (flattened, tied and smaller than 2' x 2' x 1')
- Pizza boxes (clean)
- Shoe boxes

Newsprint/Paper/Posters

- Calendars and posters
- Flyers
- Magazines
- Newspapers (no plastic bags)
- Telephone books



Food and Drink Containers

- Drink boxes or tetra packs (no straws)
- Frozen food boxes
- Frozen juice containers (lids separate)
- Juice and milk cartons

Other Paper

- Boxboard (cereal boxes)
- Bristol board (no decorations)
- Egg cartons/flats
- Greeting cards (plain)
- Paper bags
- Paper tubes/rolls
- Wrapping paper (non-metallic)

Plastic

Plastic household containers

- Antifreeze and windshield washer bottles
- Baby wipe containers
- Containers (between 2" to 9" in diameter)
- Detergent bottles and jugs
- Household cleaning product containers
- Plastic bottles/jugs
- Shampoo bottles (no black plastic)

Plastic food and drink containers

- Bakery trays and clamshells
- Clear beverage cups (no flat lids)
- Clear take-out food containers
- Egg cartons (clear plastic)
- Tubs and lids (yogurt, sour cream)
- Water and pop bottles (lids on)

Remove lids and place separately in the blue box.

- Bottles
- Jars



What goes in the green bin?

All green bin waste must be **BAGGED** and **TIED**.


- All foods (cooked, raw, bones or spoiled)
- Diapers
- Paper products
 - Food-soiled cardboard
 - Food-soiled newspaper
 - Paper towels
 - Shredded paper (small amounts)
 - Tissues
- Personal hygiene products
- Pet/animal waste

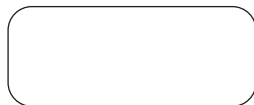
