OVERVIEW

EG's Official Plan was adopted in 2022. However, it has been updated to align with the Provincial Planning Statement, which was updated in 2024, and EG's Complete Communities Secondary Plan. Residents are welcome to attend the open house to learn more about the changes.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

The Official Plan provides a long-term vision for land use, housing, infrastructure, and environmental stewardship within East Gwillimbury. The Town's Updated Official Plan was largely adopted by Town Council in 2022, however recent changes at the provincial level require updates as the Official Plan must conform to Provincial plans and policies. The approval authority for Official Plans has also

shifted from the Region to the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing. As a result, the province will now oversee the review and approval process.

In 2023, EG also initiated a Secondary Plan process for the Town's Complete Communities Secondary Plan. The purpose of the Secondary Plan is to establish a detailed planning framework and urban land uses for the new Community Areas identified on Schedule 3 of the Town's adopted Official Plan (2022). Within the final Phase 4 of the Secondary Plan, the Complete Communities Secondary Plan has now been merged with the Town's Draft Official Plan.
